Helpful Tips: How to Trap Community Cats

1. Start a regular feeding schedule

- a. Feed the community at the same time every day for several days to get them on a feeding schedule
- b. Food should be put out for a specific time frame and picked up at the end of the time
- c. This will provide a feeding schedule for the cats, but also deter other wildlife from eating the food

2. Set traps in feeding area (optional)

- a. Bring some traps to the feeding area to get cats comfortable with them
- b. Secure traps in open position and after a few days feed in the traps
 - i. This will get the cats used to going into and out of the traps

3. Set the trap date and make vet appointments.

a. Know where, when, and how you are getting the cats to the clinic

4. Prep for trapping

- a. Stop feeding the cats 24 hours before trapping. Provide water if the weather is hot but do not feed any regular meals or treats
- b. Clear all food from the area

5. Trap day

- a. Set the traps before feeding time and move away from the area
- b. Always monitor the traps, never leave a trap unattended
- c. Never trap late at night or leave them set overnight; avoid accidental trapping of wildlife

6. After surgery

- a. Cat should remain in the trap overnight
- b. Trap needs to be inside a safe enclosed area; a garage is fine
- c. Cat needs to be kept warm and out of the weather
 - i. Anesthetized cats cannot defend themselves or regulate body temperature.
 - ii. They must be fully recovered before being released.

Things to remember:

- 1. Always keep traps covered:
 - a. Cats will remain calmer and are less likely to hurt themselves in the trap
- 2. Remove all food after trapping:
 - a. Adult cats should not eat or drink after 8pm the night before surgery
- 3. Sick cats cannot be placed under anesthesia:
 - a. If a cat is sick, arrangements to care for it prior to fix is necessary
- 4. PLEASE clean all traps before returning them
 - a. Rinse off, use dish detergent & water to wipe down trap, rinse off
- 5. If you are bitten by a cat, seek medical attention immediately
